

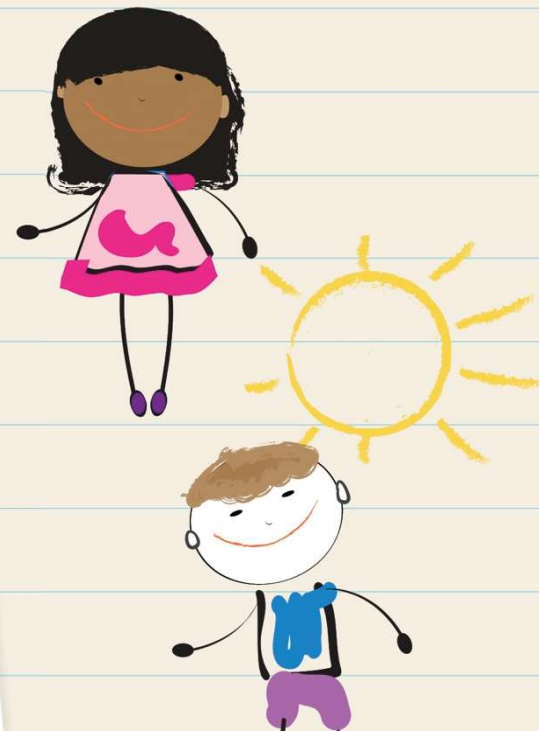

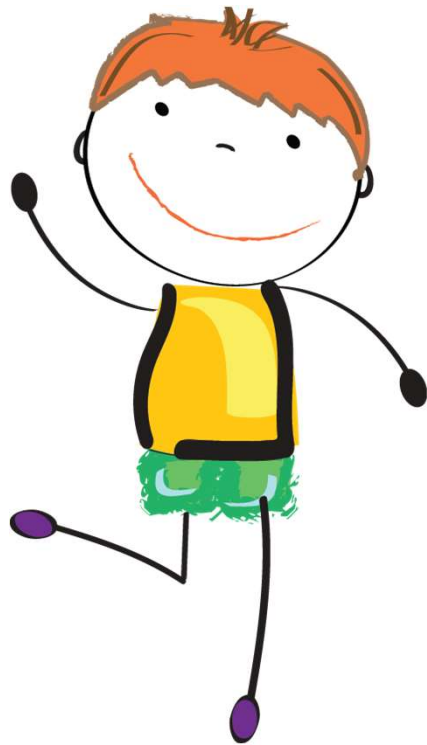

Jack decides to share his medicine with Susie.



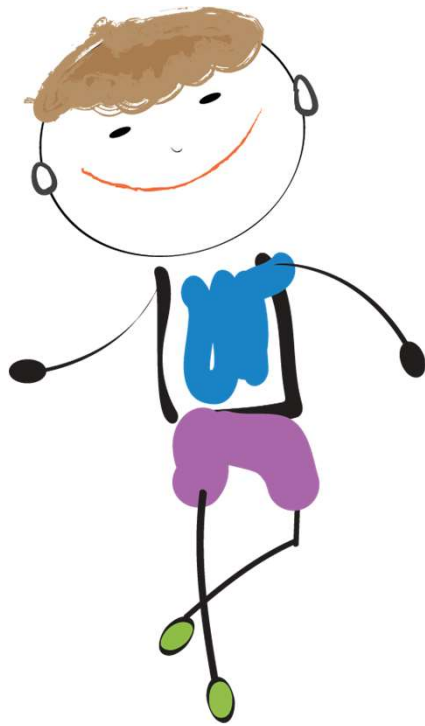
Good Choice or Bad Choice?
